Chaplain's Message

Good News When There Is Bad News! The Battle is Not Yours

John 16:33b – In this world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.

In the Broadway musical *The Wiz*, the wicked witch of the west, Evillene tells the motorcycle monkeys and the workers in her factory – “Don’t nobody bring me no bad news”. The last verse of the song she sang says “If you’re gonna bring me something, bring me something I can use - but don’t you bring me no bad news.”

“Shooting the Messenger” is a metaphoric phrase used to describe the act of blaming the bearer of bad news. In war, if the messenger brought bad news, the receiver would blame the messenger and take their anger out on them.

No one wants to be the recipient or messenger of bad news. We turn on the television and we hear the current COVID numbers – bad news. We answer our phones and receive word that someone is sick, or has been called home to be with the Lord, - bad news. 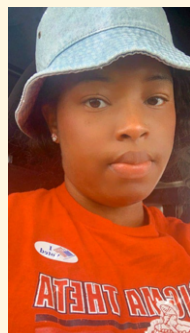
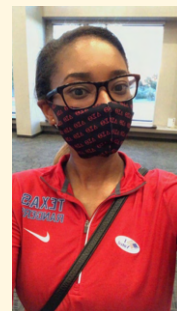

ARE YOU READY FOR THE 55TH NATIONAL CONVENTION?

CONVENTION ATTIRE (Part 1)

Grand Chapter Formal Opening

- All white suits, dresses and skirts and blouses
- Pants and hats of any kind are inappropriate and will not be allowed. Head coverings due to medical and religious reasons are permitted for all convention sessions and activities
- Avoid wearing colorful accessories, Kente cloth, or excessively large jewelry.
- The Sorority Pin and Sorority Flower, a purple violet corsage, are part of the traditional attire.
- Wraps or shawls must be all white. (All white does not refer to shoes or buttons on dresses and jackets.)
- Buttons and narrow, limited trim may be solid color (silver or gold). No print, stripes, polka dots or other multicolor designs will be allowed.
- Head coverings due to medical and religious reason are permitted.

Plenary Sessions

- Business attire is required. This includes suits, dresses, skirts and blouses and pant suites.
- Denim and khaki clothing, shorts, skirts, capris, halters and strapless tops are not considered business attire and will not be allowed.
- Bring a wrap or shawl to sessions as the air levels vary in the halls and meeting rooms.
- Paraphernalia jackets (line jackets) and sweaters are not considered business attire and should not be worn.
- Comfortable walking shoes, sandals, open-toe, and sling back shoes are appropriate and may be worn to all sessions. Rubber sole shoes, commonly referred to as flip flops, shower shoes and beach shoes are inappropriate and will not be allowed in any ceremony, plenary sessions, luncheons and banquets.

Memorial Observance

- Attire is red, black or white suits dresses and shirts and blouses.
No combination of these colors, multicolor prints or designs will be allowed.
- Pants and hats are inappropriate and will not be allowed.
- Remember to have your penlight.

- Attire is formal or after-five dresses. Extremely short or excessively revealing outfits should not be worn.

SEPTEMBER

- Policies and Procedures Committee convenes to review current Rules of Order Form, Policies and Procedures, and any policy changes from Grand Chapter.

OCTOBER

- **October 1, 2021:** Members are invited to submit proposed changes to the Policies and Procedures Committee via email (dstatxpolicies@gmail.com) using the **Recommendation for Change Form** found on page 41 of the Policies and Procedures manual. Our Policies and Procedures manual can be found on the "Members Only" section of www.dstatx.org.

DECEMBER

- **December 31, 2021:** The period to submit recommendations for changes in the Chapter's Policies and Procedures/Rules of Order using the appropriate **Recommendation for Change Form** ends.

JANUARY

- Policies and Procedures Committee meets to review and vet all proposed recommendations.

FEBRUARY

- **February 15, 2022:** Policies and Procedures Committee provides committee's decision on proposed recommendations at the Executive Board Meeting.

MARCH

- **March 5, 2022:** Policies and Procedures Committee provides committee's decision on proposed recommendations at the chapter meeting.

APRIL

- **April 2, 2022:** Austin Alumnae members vote on the proposed recommendations at the chapter meeting.

JUNE

- **June 30, 2022:** Due date for President and/or Policies and Procedures Committee to submit the Rules of Order Form; and
Due date for President and/or Policies and Procedures Committee to submit Policies and Procedures, if changed.

Doctoral Student Seeking Women to Share Their High-Risk Pregnancy Experiences

SEEKING WOMEN TO SHARE THEIR HIGH-RISK PREGNANCY EXPERIENCES

I am conducting a research study about the experiences of Black women during high-risk pregnancy and am seeking participants willing to share their story with me.

- If you are eligible, you will be asked to participate in an interview that will last up to 70-75 minutes
- Participation is completely voluntary
- If you think you are eligible and are interested in participating in this research study, please email me at lmurphy9@twu.edu or call me at (512) 366-0495

You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Identify as a Black woman
- Are 18 years of age or older
- Experienced a high-risk pregnancy and delivery 1-3 years ago

High-risk pregnancies include pregnancies with conditions such as having blood pressure problems or diabetes in pregnancy; heart, lung, liver or kidney problems in pregnancy; having had a history of premature labor and/or birth in previous pregnancies; having multiple babies during the pregnancy; problems with the placenta (placenta previa, accrete or percreta); mental health concerns; being obese in the pregnancy; or being a teenager or age 35 or older during the pregnancy; smoking during pregnancy; drinking alcohol or using drugs during pregnancy; having poorly controlled asthma in pregnancy; or having autoimmune or coagulation disorders in pregnancy.

- Did not experience the loss of the high-risk pregnancy or infant after the pregnancy
