The Blessing Is Yours for the Asking!

Luke 11: 9-10 and Romans 8:32

9 "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 10 For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. (Luke 11:9-10)

32 He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? (Romans 8:32)

There is a familiar advertising statement for the traveler which simply says – 'and we'll leave the light on for you". I believe the message to the customer is that the light is on so pullover, walk through our doors, we are present and available for your safety, comfort, and peace of mind but you must enter our doors to take advantage our amenities. So the question to ponder is whether or not this venue can deliver on the promise. But clearly, it's a decision for each individual who actually visits these premises can testify to validity of this statement.


Heritage Archive Committee Collection Efforts




INVITATION TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE WITH NCBW Interest Group

Up to \$10K in Grants Available! Apply Now!

NABJ is offering grant funding to support freelance reporters and producers at Black-owned print, broadcast, and digital outliets through the "Black Press Grant Program."

The program is supported by a grant from the <u>Chan</u> <u>Zuckerberg Initiative (CZI)</u>.

The grants aim to help ensure Black-owned media outlets are resourced with original and innovative coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic and its intersections within the nation's K-12 education system.



Journalists and those within Black-owned media are invited to submit original proposals for investigative, feature, and enterprise for a single or series of original stories published/broadcasted in Black-owned media

Fast grants to freelancers and Black-owned media will be up to \$10,000. NABJ will also distribute content produced from the grant through <u>BlackNewsandViews.com</u>, its newly launched news platform.

Program term ends December 2022.

The grant is open to journalists working at a Black-owned media organization within the United States or serving as a freelance journalist to a U.S. Black-owned news organization. NABJ membership is not required for funding support, but is helpful.


