On behalf of the Social Action Committee, Soror Kennedy was given a small token of appreciation for her judicial service in Travis County.



Membership Spotlight Congratulations on Retirement! Judge Brenda Kennedy 403rd District Court Judge Lora Livingston 261st District Court

Membership Spotlight Congratulations!

Honorable Brenda Kennedy

Judge Kennedy was elected to the 403rd District Court in 2002 and is the Presiding Judge for the Criminal Courts. She presides over both Drug Court and the Youthful Offender Support Court (YOSC). Drug Court is a multi-disciplinary drug treatment and case management intervention program. The YOSC offers select participants an opportunity to participate in a program that utilizes a collaborative effort between the Judiciary, community supervision and counseling staff to provide specialized supportive supervision, intervention, treatment and resource linkage to youthful felony clients. Prior to her election, she served as an Assistant District Attorney in Travis County. After serving on the bench for 35 years, Judge Kennedy is retiring at the end of her term in office on December 31, 2022.

Honorable Lora Livingston

Judge Lora Livingston was elected to the 261st District court in 1998. She Livingston is a graduate of the UCLA School of Law. She began her legal career as a Reginald Heber Smith Community Lawyer Fellow assigned to the Legal Aid Society of Central Texas in Austin. After completion of the fellowship program, she continued to work in the area of poverty law until she entered private practice and later opened the law firm of Livingston & Parr. In January 1995, she was sworn in as an associate judge for the District Courts of Travis County and later elected presiding judge. She is the first African American woman to serve on a district court in Travis County. She has received numerous awards for her leadership and community services, including the Outstanding Attorney award from the Travis County Women Lawyers Association and the Women of Distinction Award by the Lonestar Girl Scouts Council. After serving on the bench for 27 years, Judge Livingston is retiring at the end of her term in office on December 31, 2022.



Both Judge Kennedy and Judge Livingston are the epitome of "Black Girl Magic." As the first African American females to serve as judges in Travis County, these women are trailblazers in the legal community and role models to all little girls and women of color proving that "we" can be whatever we aspire to be.

On behalf of the Austin Alumnae Chapter and the Membership Services Committee, we salute Judge Kennedy and Judge Livingston for jobs well done in maintaining and upholding the impartiality and independence of the Texas judiciary.
