

- Move from messages about how me improve their lives to tactics that actually do.
- Move from poverty reduction message to wealth creation message
- Move from how much government spent to how much [Black] people saved

Black men and younger Black voters are less motivated by attacks on social issues... Except Abortion which is incredibly mobilizing



Message progressive issues through Black values

- Black Values = Spirituality, Family, Justice, Masculinity, Resilience
- · All masculinity is not toxic
- If God grants us all freedom of choice why should government grant women any less?
- As the head of my household I must protect my family from intrusive governments that tell them who they can, or cannot be

- Click HERE messaging to connect them to the progress they need
- Progress = Power [only if they know progress happening]
- There is a right and wrong way to talk about progress






Black gender and generational gap persisted in 2022






Most Black women plan on participating in the 2024 election and more than two-thirds believe their vote has at least some power to make change





Black Policy Progress Report



1	Economic Sustainability	 Child Tax Credits reduced Black youth poverty by 50% Black unemployment the lowest it has been in 50 years CHIPs Act invested more then \$100m too recruit and train people of color into high paying STEM jobs Raised federal minimum wage to \$15 p/hour
2	Criminal Justice Reform	 Appointed more Black women as Federal Judges then all previous presidents including the first Black SCOTUS Signed George Floyd Executive Order banning the choke holds (that killed George Floyd) and no knock warrants (that killed Breyana Taylor) Launched more pattern and practice investigations into police misconduct against Black people resulting in the removal of several Police chiefs and bad actors Used hate crime statutes to prosecuted and convict George Floyd murderer, Breyana Taylor's murderer, Amad Albury's murderer, Tops grocery murderer,
3	Student Loans	 Student debt cancellation of \$132 billion for more than 3.6 million Americans. Extended emergency student loan repayment moratorium so that nobody had to pay student loan since he has been POTUS Executive order forgiving \$10k of federal student loans and \$20k for Pell Grant recipients (70% of POC loan borrowers) In response to SCOTUS decision blocking student loan forgiveness he initiated a new income based repayment plan that has continued forgiving billions of student loans
4	Combatting Racism	 Very first act as POTUS was establishing a racial justice task force and making the largest investment in DOJ Civil Rights Division in history. Removed BLM from terrorist watch list, added Proud Boys to terrorist watch and convicted the oath Keepers on sedition charges Secured over 1000 years of federal hate crime convictions including (Amaad Arbury's murders in GA, TOP grocery murderer in Buffalo, Tree of Life murderer, etc.
